I. WIRD OF DISTINGUISHED-SERVICE CROSS. By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 Sectember 1743, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular #60 32, Hondquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Arry, 20 Earch 1944, as amended, the Distinguished-Service Cross is awarded to:

Second Lieutenant Alwar D. Conger, O887446, Field Artillery, 113th Field Artillery Battalian, United States Army, for extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations in Gersany on 26 North 1945. Lieutenant Conger, a forward observer, reved through enemy fire to a point where he was able to place an effective artillery, concentration on enemy runs which had halted his unit's advance, quickly ellencing them. He then advanced behind assaulting infantry until he was fired on by an enemy machine gum. Crawling out, he advanced and killed the entire machine run crew. When he was again fired on from a group of houses, he fired into the enemy positions to point out the tarret for a 105cm gum which soon led to the surrander of thirty-one of the enemy. The extraordinary heroism and courageous action of Lieutenant Conger reflect great great many himself and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service. I. ANATO OF DISTINGUISHED-SERVICE CROSS. By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 Karch 1944, as amended, the Distinguished-Service Cross is awarded to:

First Lioutenant Robert C. Burke, Oll80187, 118th Field Artillery Battalion, 30th Infantry Division. United States army, for extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations against the enemy. On 4 October 1944, in Germany, Licutenent Burks was serving as a forward observer for the 118th Field artillery Battalien which was supporting the 117th Infantry Regiment in an assault upon the Signification Line. The energy launched a determined counterattack throughout an active front which threatened to overrum positions. After he had delivered effective artillery fire upen the enery in his sector, Identenant Burke learned that the forward observor at another post had become a cusualty and the casty was succeeding in counterattacking the sector which had no effective artillory support. Voluntarily and in the face of somingly certain death, he left his position and moved ever a route which was being subjected to extremely heavy enemy fire, including direct fire from a Gorman tank, Arriving at the observation post at which his follow observer had been wounded, he discovered that it was now occupied by the enery. Moving on to the vicinity of the first company he had supported, he selected an ebservation post on the third floor of a building from which he directed effective artillery fires which turned this hostile attack into a decisive defeat. An estimated regiment of the fee was definited in its attack on a single infantry company. The extraordinary horoism and couragoous actions of Ligutenant Burke reflect great credit upon himself and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military rervies. Tachnical Sorgeant Ired D. Studion. 35717109. 119th Infentry Regiment. 30th Infantry Division. United States arm, for extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations against the enemy. On 28-29 July 1944, near Troisgots, France. Sorgeant Stoolman was acting as plateen leader in an advance against the enemy. When his plateen was held up by two enemy tanks protected by foot personnel and at least two machine gums, he assumed the position of lead scout and again attempted to advance to a hedgerow. The machine gums covering the hedgerow poured withering fire through gaps in the hedgerow forcing him and his non back. Five times Sorgeant Stoolman led his non forward, only to be forced to withdraw them enemy action throatened to similable his plateen. Realizing that the enemy machine gums must be climinated. Sorgeant Stoolman deliberately expected himself, drawing the enemy fire upon himself so that his non night determine the exact location of the enemy warpons.
